## 2) Reports

### 2.1 Financial position (Michael)

(Estimates are made after first five months of financial year)

**Estimated income:** \$97,700 – \$109,700 consisting of:

• WCC operational grant: \$56,364

 Hall rental (impacted by Covid 19): \$7,448.08 so far, estimated \$12,000 to \$24,000 by end of financial year

Wage subsidy: \$ 29,387

Estimated expenses: \$97,400

Salaries: \$60,814Operations: \$36,600

Others (event, GMs, AGM): ????

#### **Grants unspent:**

Governance: \$5,000 (Survey project)Lottery: \$5,000 (Use to be determined)

Other: \$10,600 (Community fridge Newtown and AVCC, garden funds)

## Accumulated funds:

Safety net of \$ 34,233

Estimated outcome: AVCC will probably break even at end of financial year (+/-\$1000)

## 2.2 Electronic communications (Liam)

AVCCC is using several platforms for electronic communication at the moment. These are (in parts) Dropbox, Slack, email, Doodle polls and Loomio for communicating within the committee, making decisions and sharing documents. The idea is to review these means of electronic communication to simplify meeting planning and administration processes in the future in order to have a more streamlined solution. Ideally this decision would happen rather earlier than later so committee members don't have to switch systems mid-work.

#### MS Teams:

- US company (-)
- office subscription needs to be changed anyway (+)
- should be free for staff, executive officers probably free, rest of committee might be cheaper (estimation --> discounted it should come up to netcost of \$ 60/month) (-)
- contractor needed to manage IT system and set up --> this is needed regardless as we need to minimise security risk in the future (+)
- virtual meeting room, chat function, webinars, events streaming possible (++)
- file sharing possible (++)
- real-time co-editing and chat on documents possible (++)
- going to be standard, already in use at most companies, governmental organisations in Aotearoa NZ-->
  easy to network (+)
- target group (NGOs) (+)
- future proof organisation (+)
- "team" like environment (+)

# 2.3 Vision for AVCC (Lorna)

Instead of only looking at day-to-day operations (running a community center as defined by WCC) it makes sense to look at a long-term strategy to protect, enhance and advance the community of Aro Valley.

**Vision:** Inspirational idea "Why are we here and what is our vision for the future?"

**Mission:** Purpose statement "What do we do, why and who are we doing it for?"

#### **Questions:**

How do we move forward? Which policies need to be reviewed and how do we update them?

How do we change them into living documents that can grow with future committees and generations?

Enhancing the character of Aro Valley should include:

History, heritage landscape, natural environment, diversity, inclusivity, accessibility, growth, te tiriti, connection, resilience

### 3. Group work and discussion

### 3.1 Outcome Breakout groups and discussion: Vision for AVCC

The group has identified several needs:

- to review and refresh policies --> suggestion to form a subcommittee that tackles code of conduct, role descriptions and the role of Te Tiriti as all three are closely related
- to review and refresh the constitution --> suggestion to form a working party to think about necessary changes. The committee would then start working towards it together with a lawyer
- to establish a register of conflicts --> suggestion for secretary and co-chair (Ingrid) to work on this
- staff --> employment subcommittee (led by one of co-chairs)
- finances --> suggestion to form a financial subcommittee, led by the treasurer
- resilience (climate, crisis, health) --> one subcommittee with different working groups
- vision and mission statement --> subcommittee to work on this

## 3.2 Outcome Breakout group and discussion: Role descriptions

As there are no existing job descriptions for officer roles, role of committee members or outlines for subcommittees/ working groups, there is a need for descriptions or definitions of these.

The breakout group has reviewed some presented definitions and will work on amendments so the descriptions will fit AVCC's needs. Ideally a handbook for future committee members would be part of the outcome.

The working group (Ayse, Ingrid and Michael) will keep on working on definitions for co-chairs, secretary, treasurer, committee members, subcommittees and working groups and aims at presenting a first draft at the next committee meeting to keep the rest of the committee updated.

# 3.3 Outcome Breakout group and discussion: Community Engagement

Ideas for Community Engagement:

- Participatory budgeting
   (Let community decide through poll what purpose a specific amount of funding is spent on)
- Arts platform: artists can ask for help from AVCC to get funding for (street-) art projects in Aro Valley
- Aro Valley Citizens and Aro Valley passport for volunteers: let people enroll as volunteers and through this become Aro Valley "citizens"
- Aro Valley currency: local currency to encouragement to spend locally
- Gardening projects (ongoing)
- Suggestion box: easy and cheap method for more community engagement
- Street art project "Before I die, I want to...": street art project to create strong sense of community
- Reactivate Valley voice (?)
- Communications strategy: to better reach younger/ tech savvy group and people on the other end who
  do not want to use online communication
- Community dinners and potlucks

Suggestion: to create a working group where ppl can join temporary or long term

#### 3.4 Outcome Breakout group and discussion: Existing and New Events

Existing projects:

- classes (Sit and be fit, Yoga)
- Aro Fair
- Room at the Inn
- School holiday program

#### New Projects:

- Xmas-tree fundraiser in cooperation with Aro school (new concept: craftwork, native plants)
- Childrens' representative from Aro school
- Civil defense planning for emergencies
- Seeds to feeds: Summer growing season project for growing food, to develop appropriate gardening strategies for this area eg home gardens, planter boxes at the Community Centre, partnering with Tanera Park Communityguerilla gardening etc and a community dinner in autumn: Barbara is the Aro Valley Seeds to Feeds coordinator
- Summer sounds (live music, at the park, led by Martin → idea: apply for resource consent
- Safety on Aro Street → a community led initiative partnering with Wellington Council that is in early stages of discussion. Seeking endorsement from committee, needs to be ratified at next meeting
